What Are The Signs Of A Urine Stream Issue?

Weak flow:

A weak, intermittent, dribbling stream. This is often accompanied by frequent urination throughout the day and night, along with a feeling of urgency to urinate. Weak flow is sometimes caused by an enlarged prostate (also known as benign prostatic hyperplasia or BPH).

Split Spraying Stream:

A split stream sprays in different directions. There may be a temporary obstruction caused by debris in or at the end of the urethra. If persistent, it could be due to a urinary tract infection or other condition.

Talking With Your Healthcare Provider About Your Urine Stream Issue

Consider the following questions to help guide your discussion:

1. How long have you been experiencing a weak or intermittent stream?
2. Does the stream issue happen every time you urinate?
3. Do you have any other symptoms such as pain or burning sensation when urinating?
4. Does your urine look cloudy or have an odor?
5. Did the stream issue occur after an illness or injury?
6. Do you have difficulty emptying your bladder?
